Highlawn Avenue Reconstruction Project & Welch Road Rehabilitation Project, Phase I

Two roadway and infrastructure improvements projects in the Village of Morrow, which began in August are presently on hold due to the Winter weather. The Highlawn Avenue Reconstruction Project is funded by the Village of Morrow's 2012 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) award. The Welch Road Rehabilitation Project, Phase I is funded, in part, through our 2013 CDBG award. Warren County Grants Administration is administering both projects on our behalf, due to the CDBG funds. The Warren County Commissioners awarded the contract to Brunk Excavating, Inc. from Monroe, Ohio, who was the low bidder on both projects, at their August 13, 2013. These projects are both being managed by Warren County Grants Administration. These projects will soon be wrapping up for the winter and will begin again in the spring with some final touch ups and repaving. Thank you for your patience!

Rumpke Now Accepts More Material in Recycling Program

Morrow residents can now recycle carton containers like juice, milk, soy milk, soup, broth, egg substitute and wine cartons, curbside. Rumpke recently announced that cartons are now accepted in its residential and commercial recycling programs. "As Ohio's recycling leader, Rumpke continues to invest heavily in our recycling programs to ensure residents can recycle the most amount of material possible," said Jeff Rumpke, vice president. "As Rumpke continues to

enhance our recycling program, manufacturers are complementing our efforts with new ways to recycle more materials."

To ensure your cartons are recycled, please follow these easy steps:

- 1. Empty the container. Containers still containing liquid will not be recycled
- 2. Remove caps or straws
- 3. Toss the carton in the recycling container with other acceptable items

In addition to cartons, residents can recycle:

- •Plastic bottles and jugs (please flatten and reattach the lid)
- •Glass bottles and jars (any color)
- Aluminum and steel cans
- Empty aerosol cans (with lids and tips removed)
- Paperboard (cereal boxes, 12-pack containers, etc.)
- Cardboard (broken down to 3'-by-3' sections)
- A variety of paper products, including:
- Office paper
- Newspaper

- Magazines
- Junk mail and envelopes (with or without windows)
- Telephone books
- Paper grocery bags

The Underground Railroad in the Warren County Museum

Visit a recreation of the Butterworth family cabin, Quakers whose home was a major stop on the Underground Railroad. Thrill to the diorama of a slave family running just out of sight of a slave catcher on horseback: learn about John McLean and his role in the Dred Scott decision and much more. Cut Down in the Bloom of a Promising Youth: The Death of Henry Clay's Daughter Eliza in Lebanon, Ohio Early in 1825, the great Kentucky statesman, Henry Clay thought that 1825 was going to be his year. Everything was going his way. He had just been appointed U.S. secretary of state and he saw this as a stepping stone to the U.S. presidency. The year turned out to be one of the most tragic he would ever have to endure culminating with the death of his 12-year-old daughter Eliza in the strange town of Lebanon, Ohio. This talk will explore how this tragedy, and others that beset Henry Clay in 1825, unfolded. The speaker will be John J. Zimkus, Historian of the Warren County Historical Society. Schools may choose from one of these four programs. Admission is free for teachers, students and bus drivers. Parent admission fee is \$5.00 per person. A limited amount of grants are available to help defray the cost of bus transportation to our site.

What to Know About Small-Business Licenses and Permits

So, you're starting a business – congratulations! You already know that there's a lot to take care of, from choosing your business structure to registering your business. You'll probably also need a business license or permit – virtually every business does in order to operate legally. It depends on the kind of business you run, where it's located and what state and federal rules apply. Here's what you should know to make sure you'll be running your business within the law.

Why Does My Businesses Need a License or Permit?

<u>Licenses and permits</u> serve two major purposes: They allow the government to track your business's revenue for tax purposes, and they also protect the public.

For example, if your business is involved in <u>activities supervised and regulated by a federal agency</u> – such as selling alcohol, firearms, radio broadcasting, commercial fishing, etc. – then you'll likely need to obtain a federal license or permit.

Other special state licenses, known as professional licenses, are required for dentists, hairdressers, veterinarians, realtors, physicians and more. These licenses indicate the level of expertise of an employee or business owner and that they've met a certain requirements when it comes to training or education. State licenses are also required of businesses, such as restaurants and those that serve alcohol, to demonstrate that they meet certain state standards or codes. Particular regulations may vary by state.

Defined by local and/or state laws, permits generally regulate the safety, structure and appearance of a community and its establishments. There are a number of different kinds of permits to be aware of, including:

- Seller's Permits if you're purchasing wholesale merchandise for resale
- Building Permits if you're remodeling or building commercial space
- Health Permits if you're preparing food
- Home Occupation Permits if you're running a home-based business

What About Tax Permits?

The IRS doesn't license your business, but it does require that certain businesses register to receive a federal tax identification number. You'll also need to register with state and local government agencies for applicable tax permits such as a sales tax license, income tax withholding and unemployment insurance tax.

Managing and Maintaining Your License or Permit

Once you have vour license or permit, you'll need to manage and maintain it. Keep these tips in mind to help make sure you don't lose sight of your obligations:

- Keep track of renewal dates.
- Keep a copy of all licensing applications and forms in your business records.
- Display your licenses or permits correctly. Most states and localities require businesses to prominently display their business licenses so customers can see them.
- If you expand your business whether it's physical building expansion or launching a new product or service you may need additional business licenses.

4 Marketing Resolutions to Make This Year

If there's one area of operations most small businesses can stand to improve, it's marketing. As a small business expert, I get more questions about marketing than any other aspect of business—and it's been that way for the last 30 years. Since the New Year is all about improving oneself, how about making some marketing resolutions for your business? Here are four to consider.

1. <u>I resolve to make a marketing plan.</u> Many small business owners market haphazardly, throwing time and money at one marketing method and then, when it doesn't pay off immediately, switching gears to the "next big thing." This scattershot approach does nothing but waste your resources and leave you frustrated and frazzled, convinced that marketing doesn't pay off. Instead, resolve to sit down and set goals for your marketing this year. What exactly do you want to accomplish—more leads, more sales closed, more inquiries? Once you've got goals on paper, figure out the marketing methods that are

- most likely to get those desired results. Finally, figure out how you'll track results from each marketing method so you can see what's really working.
- 2. I resolve to market consistently. It's easy to fall into the trap of marketing only when you've got the "spare" time for it (which often means "never"). Or maybe you market wildly right before your busy season, then do nothing for months on end. As a result, your sales pipeline slows down. Keep your pipeline full by marketing consistently all year long. That doesn't mean you need the *same* level of marketing year-round—for instance, a toy retailer would obviously market more before and during the holiday shopping season than in, say, July—but it does mean you need *some* level of marketing all year. Create a marketing calendar that sets out what you'll do each month and breaks it down further into weekly and even daily marketing efforts. Then put someone in charge of making sure it's all carried out.
- 3. I resolve to keep learning new things. Is your marketing stuck in the past? Advertising only in the print Yellow Pages might work if your clientele is solely seniors...and even seniors are increasingly going online to find businesses instead of letting their fingers do the walking. If you want your business to grow, you've got to keep up with the (marketing) times. Resolve to regularly read industry blogs and publications, attend networking events and conferences, and take webinars and seminars to learn more about new marketing trends and how they're affecting your industry. Pledge to learn something new every month, and at least try some of it. Marketing is moving fast, and if you don't keep up you're going to get left behind.
- 4. <u>I resolve to do market research.</u> Many small business owners see market research as something they do once—when starting their companies—and then never do again. But what happens when your market changes? The 20-somethings you might have targeted with your extreme sports company in 1998 are now in their 40s. Even if they're still buying extreme sports products, the way you market to them needs to be different now from what it was then. Keep tabs on the demographics of your target market so you can adjust your marketing approach to changes in their incomes, lifestyles, media consumption habits and buying behaviors. Use both secondary research from other sources and primary research—that is, simply asking your customers what they want and need.

These four simple resolutions will make a big difference in your results.

Webinar: Not Just Contracts: How to Navigate the SBA's 8(a) Business Development Program

Are you an owner of a small disadvantaged business seeking to be certified in the U.S. Small Business Administration's (SBA) 8(a) Business Development Program and to become competitively viable in the federal marketplace?

Each year, companies graduate from the 8(a) program with the potential and capabilities to grow into successful businesses as a result of the business development tools received while in the program. Worldwide Technology, Inc. is one of many examples of successful graduates of the 8(a) Program and was #1 on *Black Enterprise Magazine's* list of the "Largest Black-Owned Firms" in 2013.

The 8(a) Program – What is it?

The SBA certifies small businesses considered to be socially and economically disadvantaged under its nine-year 8(a) Business Development Program. Individuals who are members of certain minority groups are considered to be socially disadvantaged. These groups include: African Americans, Hispanic Americans, Native Americans, Asian Pacific Americans and Subcontinent Asian Americans. Firms owned by Alaska Native Corporations, Indian Tribes, Native Hawaiian Organizations, and Community Development Corporations are also eligible to participate in the program.

The 8(a) Program helps these firms develop and grow through one-to-one counseling, training workshops and management and technical guidance. It also provides access to government contracting opportunities, allowing them to become solid competitors in the federal marketplace. In fiscal year 2012, small businesses received more than \$15.8 billion in 8(a) contract dollars.

The SBA will conduct two one-hour webinars to help small businesses learn:

- the eligibility requirements for 8(a) certification;
- about the technical assistance available through the 8(a) Program;
- about common myths and misconceptions about the 8(a) Program; and
- the top reasons why an 8(a) application is declined or returned.

SBA Announces New Measures to Help Get Small Business Loans into the Hands of Veterans

The U.S Small Business Administration (SBA) today announced new measures to help get small business loans into the hands of veterans by setting the borrower upfront fee to zero for all veteran loans authorized under the SBA Express program up to \$350,000. This initiative will start on January 1 and continue through the end of the fiscal year.

"Our nation's veterans are highly-skilled and highly-trained leaders in their communities," said Acting SBA Administrator Jeanne Hulit. "This initiative will set fees to zero for SBA Express loans to veterans up to \$350,000, and is part of SBA's broader efforts to make sure that veterans have the tools they need to start and grow a business. As we honor our veterans and thank them for their service and sacrifice, let's continue to identify ways to support them when they come home."

Of all SBA loans that go to veterans, 73 percent are \$350,000 and below. The SBA Express Loan Program, which supports loans under \$350,000, is SBA's most popular loan delivery method, with nearly 60 percent of all 7(a) loans over the past decade being authorized through the program. Since the program's inception, it has also been one of the most popular delivery methods for getting capital into the hands of veteran borrowers. Building on SBA's recent announcement that for the current fiscal year, fees on loans for \$150,000 and under are set to zero, this policy announcement means that veteran borrowers will no longer have to pay an upfront fee for any loan up to \$350,000 under the SBA Express program. This new initiative will go into effect January 1 and extend for the duration of the fiscal year. This will make the loans cheaper for the borrower, another way SBA is looking to serve small business owners as they look for ways to access capital.

Today's announcement comes during SBA's National Veterans Small Business Week, an initiative on the part of the U.S. Small Business Administration to reach out to veteran entrepreneurs and business owners. During Veterans Small Business Week, SBA staff all across the country have been working with partner organizations

on educational efforts, mentoring, and trainings to make sure veterans have the tools they need to start or grow their business.

SBA provides veterans access to business counseling and training, capital and business development opportunities through government contracts. In FY 2013, SBA supported \$1.86 billion in loans for 3,094 veteran-owned small businesses. And since 2009, the dollar amount of SBA lending support to veteran-owned firms has nearly doubled.

Get Ready For The Tax Filing Season

This week we will look at some of the more common forms that you should be watching for in the coming weeks and months:

<u>W-2:</u> Employers should mail these by 1/31/14. If you have moved during the year, make sure former employers are aware of your new address.

<u>W-2G:</u> Casinos, Lottery Commissions and other gambling entities should mail these **by 1/31/14** if you have gambling winnings above a certain threshold.

NOTE: Some casinos will issue you a W-2G at the time you win a jackpot. Make sure you have saved those throughout the year.

<u>1099-INT:</u> Banks, Credit Unions, Brokerage firms, etc. will issue these **by 1/31/14** to show the amount of interest income you earned on your savings/investments.

<u>1099-DIV</u>: Brokerage firms, mutual funds, etc. have **until 2/14/14** to issue these forms to show the dividend income you earned for the year.

<u>1099-B:</u> Brokerage firms, mutual funds, etc. have **until 2/14/14** to show the proceeds from the sale of stocks and mutual funds. Most brokerage firms have gotten better at showing the cost basis on the sale of these investments. If the statements do not show the basis, then you have some homework to do before filing your tax return.

NOTE: Most of the larger brokerage firms issue "Consolidated Statements" that have the 1099-INT, 1099-DIV and 1099-B earnings reported on the same report.

<u>K-1s:</u> If you are a partner in a business or a limited partner in some investments, your income and expenses will be reported to you on a K-1. The tax returns for these entities are not due **until 4/15/14** (if they have a calendar-year accounting). Sometimes, you may not receive a K-1 until shortly after the entities' tax return is filed in April.

If you are a beneficiary of an estate or trust, your share of the income and expenses for the year will also be reported on a K-1. The timing of when you may receive your K-1 is the same as outlined above.

NOTE: Many times partnerships, estates and trusts will put their tax returns on extension. If they do, the due date of the return is not **until 9/15/14**. We often see client's receiving K-1s in the third week of September.

If you receive, or expect to receive, a K-1 it may be best if you place your personal return on extension. It is a
