Over 60 people attended last year’s inaugural event and enjoyed free hot dogs, soda and water, talked with officers and Village staff, inspected police vehicles, learned about the Morrow Neighborhood Watch Program, and were provided with free literature on a variety of topics. The National Association of Town Watch began the National Night Out program in 1984 as an effort to promote involvement in crime prevention activities, police-community partnerships, neighborhood camaraderie, and send a message to criminals letting them know that neighborhoods are organized and fighting back. The quicker the Salem-Morrow Fire Department's firefighters or EMT's can locate you, the quicker we can begin helping you and your family. In an effort to locate your home or business in an emergency, the Salem-Morrow Fire Department is providing a 6" x 18" reflective sign that will clearly display your street address. These signs are invaluable to firefighters, EMT's, and police officers, who may be looking for your home in your time of need. Similar signs have been installed in other communities with startling results. The Salem-Morrow Fire Department is selling these signs at the low cost of \$12.00 each.

If you wish to have the SMFD mount your sign for you, they will do so for \$14.00. Each sign has your street address prominently displayed on both sides in highly reflective 3" numbers against a green background similar to those on an interstate sign. The signs are installed in such a way that assures their visibility, even in high grass and snowy weather conditions.

If you would like to purchase one of these signs, simply stop by the Salem-Morrow Fire Department, 5270 East U. S. Route 22 & State Route 3, Morrow, Ohio 45152, to complete an order form. In approximately 7 days, your sign will be ready for pickup or installation. Generally, the signs can be made, while you wait, in less than 10 minutes. Salem-Morrow Fire Department Residential Knox Box Program

The Salem / Morrow Fire Department has started a Residential Knox Box Program to help us help you.

What is Knox Box? It's a heavy duty box that we hang on your door that has your home key in it. We have a Master key that we use to open the box in an emergency situation so we can make access to your home and let use help you.

The reason we started the program is to help us make entry to our citizens without causing damage to their property. We receive calls to residents homes and when we get there we are unable to make access do to the house is locked up tight. We end up breaking into the house to help with their emergency and then they have an extra expense fixing what we had to break. Residents stop by and offer us keys so we do not have to break in. That would be a lot of keys for us to have and maintain. This would cause more of a hindrance then help.

This program is for residents that have chronic medical problems, elderly folks that live alone, persons with disabilities that would make it hard for them to let us in, and that live in our protection area. If you are not sure if you qualify, contact Chief LaFollette or Assistant Chief Harrison. This is a free service provided to our residents for as long as they need it.

This program was started by donations to the fire department. We have purchased 6 Knox Boxes and Key Secure Systems. The Key Secure Systems secures the key to the vehicle and tracks who uses it. This gives us an accountability system on the use of the key. Supplies are limited.

The Salem/Morrow Fire Department requests that an application form be filled out. When approved, we will come out to install the Knox Box. Application forms may be picked up at the Salem/Morrow Fire Department. Many of our most prominent pioneers were known not only for their good works at home but also their contributions on the national scene. Their stories, which will entertain educate and inspire people of all ages, are contained in the Warren County History Center.

Tell me more: The Warren County Historical Society offers four hands on, interactive school tour programs which address the revised State of Ohio Academic Content Standards students in grades 4-. The programs are:

2. Exploring Pioneers Technology – Ohio Academic Content Statements 3, 8 & 23
3. Warren County and the Underground Railroad – Ohio Academic Content Statements 5, 7 & 14

May Lunch & Learn – It Cures Like Magic: The Fads and Frauds of the Golden Age of Patent Medicine Quackery – May 21

Topic: 19th century America witnessed a boom in the "patent medicine" industry. Patent medicines were NOT medicines that had been "patented" but rather "secret formulas" and unproven remedies that were sold directly to the public as medical cures. Some patent medicines did very little harm; others actually delivered their promised results, albeit often with very dangerous ingredients; and still others were what amounts to poisons. Dennis will display and discuss the supposed curative properties of some his personal collection of patent medicine potions, and bottles, many of which were actually from Warren County.

The annual Landscape Plant Sale will begin at 10. This popular event features annual and perennial bedding plants, just in time for spring planting and Mother's Day. All proceeds from sales go toward student learning activities in the Landscape program.

Samantha Sandlin, Lebanon, a senior in the Warren County Career Center Landscape program, ordered the starts for the plant and flower sale and is carefully tending them along with her classmates. Her instructor, Delohn Collins, assigned her to oversee the plant sale last year, which featured some 27,000 mostly flowering plants. This year she is offering more varieties of flowers and is excited to see them all in bloom.

"We will have about the same number of plants, but I have ordered some new colors and varieties," she said. "We will sell double impatiens, petunias and begonias in colors such as bubblegum pink, golden pink, plum vein and burgundy ice."

All of the plant starts come in about the size of a fingernail, and have to be hand-transplanted several times as they grow. The program has two large greenhouses and one smaller one for the students to practice their skills. Samantha said it takes about two hours to water them all each day. The spring bedding plants and fall poinsettia growing in the greenhouses take up part of the curriculum. The students also work outside on the grounds of several area schools and parks, and become certified in pesticide, skid steer and mower operations. WCCC is located at 3525 N. ABLE/GED/ESOL

Register for [GED Voucher](#)

Warren County ABLE (Adult Basic and Literacy Education) is a part of the Ohio Board of Regents and the University System of Ohio. It provides instructional services to adults who need to earn their high school credentials (GED), upgrade the basic skills of reading, writing, and/or math, or learn English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL). Services are available to adults ages 18 and older. Sixteen and seventeen year-olds are also welcome with verification of withdrawal from the public schools (e.g. GED Age Waiver Form OR official school letterhead signed by the superintendent or designee.) However, to be eligible for ABLE services,

18-year-olds must provide official withdrawal documentation from their home district or evidence of a high school diploma for other ABLÉ services. Day and evening classes are held at convenient locations throughout Warren County. The classes are designed to help each student meet his or her specific needs and goals. Instruction and materials are supplied to all students free of charge. Warren County Career Center offers the GED exam on computer at its Regional Accredited Testing Centers in Lebanon and Kings Mills. The GED computer test allows access to instant test scores on three of the four content areas. The ABLÉ office offers assistance at no charge to anyone wishing to brush up on their academic skills in preparation for the GED or for any other reason such as entering advanced training or college.

Warren County ABLÉ Adult Services

Basic Skills Review/Transitions

Basic Skills Review is offered for adults who need to learn or upgrade their math, reading, writing, and/or English skills. Basic Skills instruction is available to all adults regardless of educational background. ABLÉ offers a special skills upgrade class for adults who wish to 'transition' to post-secondary education. An individual learning plan is set up to help meet the specific needs and goals of each student. Coursework can prepare the adult student for pre-employment testing, higher education opportunities, college placement, and/or career advancement. Instruction and materials are provided free to all students.

GED Preparation

The G.E.D. (General Educational Development) offers adults a second chance to gain their high school credentials. Instruction is provided for adults who have not completed their high school education. The Ohio High School Equivalence Diploma (G.E.D.) can open the doors to many other opportunities such as employment, technical school, and college. The official G.E.D. exam consists of four sub-tests. The exam is timed and takes about 7.5 hours to complete. The Warren County Career Center offers G.E.D. testing by appointment. G.E.D. classes are designed to prepare adult students for the exam. Coursework includes math, language arts, science and social studies exercises that correspond to the content of the G.E.D. exam. Instruction and materials are provided free to the students. Click [HERE](#) for more details on how to register to take the GED exam.

ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages)

ESOL class is designed for the adult who does not speak English as his/her native language. Interactive, small-group instruction emphasizes the essential skills of reading, writing, and conversational English. Students will also learn about American culture and traditions. Citizenship preparation is provided as needed. Instruction and materials are free.

High School Students Connecting with Industry

Juniors and seniors at WCCC are preparing to take the next steps toward their careers. One key to successful career transition is having a connection to business and industry and earning meaningful certifications. The Health Science juniors at right are shown on their internships at Otterbein Lebanon, working on their State-Tested Nursing Assistant certification. Recently, seniors in the HVAC/Environmental Science program heard about job opportunities from Airtron. Many of our seniors are already in the workforce this spring, and looking at jobs and further education.

Julie Green Selected as 2014 Project Excellence Teacher

Warren County Career Center Career Assessment Coordinator Julie Green was selected as the 2014 Project Excellence Educator for WCCC. Project Excellence, an arm of the Area Progress Council of Warren County, recognizes teachers in Warren County each year through a nomination and committee review process. Mrs. Green was raised in Oregon and earned her Bachelor and Master of Education from Eastern Oregon State University. She taught various subjects in grades 9-12 for five years in Oregon before marrying and moving to Ohio.

She attended Miami University to earn her special education certification. Her first full-time job in Ohio was as the Vocational Special Education Coordinator at WCCC, which she did for three years. She took the position of career assessment at WCCC in 1996.

Career Assessment is essentially career counseling. Mrs. Green works with small groups of students from the six partner high schools – Franklin, Kings, Lebanon, Little Miami, Springboro and Waynesville – to help them learn more about their career interests, strengths that they would use in job settings and learn more about the career center in general to see if it would be a good fit for them.

The assessments include manual dexterity and coordination for using large and small tools and online and paper interest surveys that help narrow the students' focus to certain career clusters or categories. She takes the students on a tour of the building to look at career center students participating in their labs on a regular school day. "I like to give my guests an understanding of what a typical school day is like," she said. "I usually take them into labs they request that they want to see."

Afterward she schedules a follow up meeting with the student and his or her parents to review the results of the career assessment and talk about options for potential courses and career paths. She works primarily with grades 9-10, and takes referrals from counselors and teachers. Sometimes parents call her and ask how their child can get a career assessment.

"It is rewarding for me to see these kids I met when they were freshmen progress through a career center program as they reach their career dreams," she said. "I find it interesting because in some ways every day follows a schedule, but each day is different because of the uniqueness of each student. My philosophy is that I treat families with the respect I would want to be treated with and I treat students how I would want teachers to treat my children."

Tom Harris Awarded for Exemplary Leadership

Warren County Career Center Director of Adult Education Tom Harris was honored recently with the William B. Ruth Award for Exemplary Leadership and Outstanding Contribution to Adult Workforce Development. Mr. Harris, a native of Milford and a graduate of Milford High School, received this honorary award at the Ohio ACTE Postsecondary Adult Career Educators Division annual conference in Columbus. The award is named for Bill Ruth, 93, a pioneer of adult education programs and who, according to the certificate, demonstrated "hard work, innovation, action, a fighting spirit and a passion for adult education." Mr. Ruth was unable to attend the ceremony, but still presented the award in person to Mr. Harris.

"At the conference, they told me we were taking a road trip," Mr. Harris said. "We arrived at Bill Ruth's house – I really didn't expect that. Each year nominations are submitted by members of PACE, and voted on by the membership. It was overwhelming to be selected, and then to be able to be awarded by Bill Ruth himself was quite an honor."

Mr. Harris began as Director of Adult Education at WCCC in 2007. At that time, there were about six full-time programs with an estimated enrollment of about 200. This year, there are 14 full-time programs with enrollment of about 500. There are also numerous part-time programs that currently serve another 5,000 to 6,000 students per year. Full-time programs of 600 hours or more can offer financial aid, which helps more people to be able to take training.

New full-time programs include Electrical Power Line Mechanic, with two satellite locations along with the program on the main campus; Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning; Basic Police Officer Academy at Southern Hills Career Center; Medical Multiskilled Technician and Cosmetology Management. Programs that have expanded from part-time to full-time are Cisco Certified Network Administrator, Microsoft Certified Solutions Associate, Electromechanical PLC Technician, Welding Technician/AWS Certified, and Heavy Equipment and Site Construction Technician.

"We have expanded our footprint from Lebanon and our South Campus in Kings Mills to Piqua, Sharonville and Georgetown," Mr. Harris said. "I am most proud of the quality of the education we are putting out. Every one of our programs has an 80 to 90 percent placement rate. I am also very proud of our excellent staff. We have really dedicated people here who are constantly working to improve a good program and make it even better. We work closely with our business community as this truly is a community-driven school."

Mr. Harris is retired from the U.S. Air Force with a total of 30 years active and inactive reserve duty, and served in Operation Desert Storm in Southwest Asia. He has worked in the adult education arena for 30 years, beginning while in the military.

In this online activity, "[Decoding Mars](#)," students will learn pattern recognition skills by looking at geologic structures on Earth. They will learn about folds, layering, and faults; examine evidence of geologic formations created by flowing water, blowing sand, or volcanic eruption; and learn to recognize igneous, metamorphic, and sedimentary formations from rock slices.
