

Get Your Car Seat Safety Inspection at the Salem-Morrow Fire Department

Did you know these Child Passenger Safety Facts (from safekids.org)?

- Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death among children ages 3 to 14.
- Correctly used child safety seats are extremely effective and reduce the risk of death as much as 71%.
- Nearly 73% of child restraints are not installed or used correctly.
- Nearly half of kids 14 and under who died in crashes were completely unrestrained.

You can come to the Salem-Morrow Fire Department for car seat checks which are conducted by National Child Passenger Safety Board certified technicians. Appointments can be made by calling Salem Morrow Fire Department at 513-899-2222 or emailing jzwerling@station71.com. Please allow approximately 30-45 minutes per car seat. When you come in for a car seat check please have the following:

- The car seat (not in the box if new)
- The car seat instructions
- The vehicle owner's manual

All parents/caregivers and any children riding in the car should try to be at the appointment.

Salem-Morrow Fire Department Cadet Program

The Salem-Morrow Fire Department Cadets is a youth oriented program directed at helping young adults who have an interest in the field of firefighting and Emergency Medical Services, as well as, to assist the Salem-Morrow Fire Department when able.

The program meets on the 1st (first) Monday of the month at the fire station at 1800 hrs. Cadets are required to participate in the department's fire training, held the 2nd (second) Monday of each month at 1830 hrs. Cadets are taught the basic skills of firefighting and first aid. Much of the training is hands-on and is supervised by Fire Department personnel. Meetings also include public service projects and fund raising activities.

Cadets are allowed to respond with the department to any "station response", provided that he/she is not serving any type of suspension – school or program. During the school year, cadets are permitted to make runs from the time that school is dismissed for the day until 9:30pm, only if school assignments are complete or at the discretion of parents/guardians. If cadets are on a response close to the 9:30pm cut-off, every attempt will be made to return them to the station to meet their parents/guardians or to take them home. During school vacations/breaks, cadets are allowed to run around the clock, but only at the discretion of his/her parent/guardian.

Cadets will learn how hard work, discipline, and a structured work environment in the fire service promote safety and teamwork toward successfully completing a common objective. All members shall be trained and certified in Basic First Aid and C.P.R. Cadets will also gain a sense of pride in serving the community. Parents will witness the positive outcome by having their child enroll in this growing program.

The Cadets are always in search of energetic young men and women who are eager to learn more about the fire service. Any student between the ages of 14 and 18 years of age with a grade point average of 1.0 or greater is eligible to apply.

These signs are invaluable to firefighters, EMT's, and police officers, who may be looking for your home in your time of need. Similar signs have been installed in other communities with startling results. The Salem-Morrow Fire Department is selling these signs at the low cost of \$12.00 each. If you wish to have the SMFD mount your sign for you, they will do so for \$14.00. Each sign has your street address prominently displayed on both sides in highly reflective 3" numbers against a green background similar to those on an interstate sign. The signs are installed in such a way that assures their visibility, even in high grass and snowy weather conditions. If you would like to purchase one of these signs, simply stop by the Salem-Morrow Fire Department, 5270 East U. S. Route 22 & State Route 3, Morrow, Ohio 45152, to complete an order form. In approximately 7 days, your sign will be ready for pickup or installation. Generally, the signs can be made, while you wait, in less than 10 minutes. Quaker Heritage Center News

"The War to End All Wars" Exhibit at the Quaker Heritage Center – Now through December 12

100 years ago, one of the Earth's most deadly conflicts began: World War I. By the end of "The War to End All Wars," over 37 million people were dead, wounded, or listed missing. "It's a story that we tend to forget," said Ruth Brindle, Curator of the Quaker Heritage Center. "World War I is often overshadowed by World War II, particularly here in the United States, where the war's impact wasn't felt as acutely as it was in Europe. That's why we felt this exhibit - *The Pity of War: Words and Images of World War I* - is necessary."

The exhibit **will be on display through December 12, 2014**, and opens with a brief overview of the chronology of the war itself, then delves into the stories of those who lived through those events as soldiers, civilians, and Conscientious Objectors. "Using the words of these individuals, and highlighting those stories with images from the period, really brings the experience home on a personal level," Brindle noted. Of particular interest to the mission of the Quaker Heritage Center is the inclusion of stories of individual Quakers who registered as Conscientious Objectors or volunteered for relief work in war-torn Europe. That particular interest is why Stephen Angell, Geraldine Leatherock Professor of Quaker Studies at Earlham School of Religion, will be the guest lecturer at the exhibit opening. His talk, "A. Neave Brayshaw and the Re-Invigoration of the Quaker Peace Testimony During World War I," will explore the way the Religious Society of Friends (Quakers) responded to the War. The exhibit will be on display at the Quaker Heritage Center of Wilmington College from July 28 through December 12, 2014. The Center is open Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., and the last Saturday of each month, 12 noon to 5 p.m. Contact Ruth M. Diverting Your Septic System Instructions

1. You'll need a "key" to do this. One was provided as a part of the septic system installation and may be stored inside one of the risers on your tank. If your key has been misplaced, a replacement can be purchased from your local hardware store.
2. Take the lid off the white PVC pipe that sticks up out of the ground. You will see a 1 and 2 at the 11:00 and 1:00 positions. (If they are obscured by mud, pour water in to rinse them.)
3. Use the key to turn the valve to the other number. It may be quite difficult to turn but will not break.
4. Return the lid and forget about it until you receive your next reminder in 6 months.

Additional Reminders

Six months from now, and every 6 months thereafter, you'll receive an email reminding you to divert your system. If you move or want to stop receiving the reminders, you can always unsubscribe at the bottom of each email.

Shelton's Produce and Glory Farms at Deerfield Farmers Market & Lebanon Farm Market

We went from picking produce in a sweatshirt to bundling up and boots and a fire in the greenhouse, very quickly. Not sure what is going under the frost cover under the snow out in the gardens. When it warms up and the snow melts, we will check. The drastic temperature change probably means the end of the tomatoes, and possibly the peppers. However, the chickens are happy. We have to keep them in their pen (our chickens are cage free, but have to be kept from the gardens). Now we open the gate every day and they happily pillage the gardens. Speaking of chickens, we have a balance of 13 chickens available now, of the young chickens. These are \$2.75 a pound, and this week they did average 4 lbs. dressed weight. However, I will have stewing chickens available most of the winter, at \$2 a pound, and the young chickens available again, possibly in February. My mother always loved February, because March was right around the corner, and whatever else happens in March, there are usually a few days promising Spring. Okay, CSA's this week will be some tomatoes, eggs, mustard greens (very nice and tender), kale, and chard. Possibly small bell peppers. Remember in winter as in summer, you can substitute with baked goods or even chickens. Or jams. Also, we are baking pies and cobblers for Thanksgiving, baking them the day before and delivering in the Lebanon location in the afternoon, probably 3. And if you are working I can leave them in a safe location, delivered. You can also pick up at the farm. Pumpkin, apple, peach (from canned peaches), and also

blackberry cobblers. Pricing is the small peach cobblers at \$5, \$10 for peach, apple, or pumpkin pies. \$15 for the deep dish apple or peach pies. \$12 for 10" blackberry cobblers. Alright, as usual, order ahead to insure your needs. And we are always at the Lebanon location on Thursdays, from 3 till 5. And always deliver every Saturday to the Deerfield location from 10 till 11. This week we will also be at the Twin Lakes Christmas Bazaar on 22 & 3 in Montgomery, from 11 till 4.

Call to Arms for All Boosters

Little Miami School District is one of the fastest-growing areas in southwest Ohio. Our community is primarily rural, covering 98 square miles of mostly farmland. The economic upswing in recent years has brought new development into our area, and we now have our largest enrollment ever.

The education our school district provides continues to be rated excellent by the state of Ohio. We are proud of this accomplishment and feel this helps make our community attractive for potential homebuyers.

The LMABC currently supports over 850 athletes in grades 7-12. Our plan is simple: to bring our sporting teams up to the level of our education. It is with this spirit that we come to you seeking aid for our student-athletes.

One of the problems our athletes face is an inadequate training facility. Our current weight room is 900 square feet and can't house more than 15 kids at a time. The school board has given the Boosters the opportunity to transform the former Industrial Arts room (3,600 square feet) into a training facility, but the Boosters must pay 100% of the costs. With several initiatives going forward, this state-of-the-art training facility is by far our largest, with an estimated cost of \$175,000. We are now beginning a fund drive to accomplish this goal.

There is opportunity in the corporate world for us to raise money. There are a few organizations who might match funds with us for the advancement of sports. The Cincinnati Bengals, for example, recently announced a matching grant for \$150,000 to Harrison High School for the installation of a new turf field. The Bengals have done this for numerous schools, but seemingly always for the installation of a turf field, and always in a matching-grant scenario. We have feelers out with them as well as many other corporations in the Cincinnati area. We are trying to reach out to any businesses that can help us advance our athletic facilities.

These opportunities are exciting and yet unsure. The bottom line is that we have to have a plan in place to assure that this training center comes to fruition. That is where we must begin: with you! We need our alumni base, parents of student-athletes, parents of non student-athletes, parents of past student-athletes, local businesses, and companies you work for or with. In other words, we need to pull from every aspect of our lives.

The average citizen, who does not have a student-athlete or care much for sports, may ask how athletics would affect his/her life. A National Center for Education Statistics study shows that children who participate in extracurricular activities will have a higher GPA, have a higher percentage of post-secondary education, have a healthier lifestyle (by percentage of non-smokers and non-binge drinkers), earn a higher average income, and tend to stay in (or return to) the school district they grew up in. This makes our school district more desirable to live in, and thus raises our property values and provides us with a greater customer base for our local businesses. We truly are all in this together.

It would be easy to say that if everyone in the school district would donate \$100 then we would probably exceed our goals. Honestly, the reach is not far from that. If our local businesses could partner with us in

exchange for advertising, we would encourage everyone to give those businesses a better consideration.

If the loss of one outstanding young man this year taught us anything, it's that we are truly a community that cares. It is with that sense of closeness that I ask you kindly to support the initiative before us. Let us build something we all can be proud of.

Friends of the Little Miami State Park News

Join Us for Our Next Meeting – November 23

Next year will be an exciting one not only for Friends of the Little Miami State Park but for all who love and use the trail. Several pieces of good news promise a better trail experience in 2015 and beyond:

- The Little Miami State Park will receive a significant share of the \$88.5 million that Ohio State Parks is investing in the 74 state parks, announced by Ohio Department of Natural Resources Director Jim Zehringer in June. This month, FLMSP president Steve Murphy and board members Aaron Rourke and Don Mills toured the trail with Gary Obermiller, Chief of Ohio State Parks. With the help of FLMSP's Master List of all trail features and problems, Obermiller saw firsthand the conditions along the trail. As a result of this tour, Little Miami State Park will receive capital to resolve trail slumps and erosion and drainage problems to prepare the trail for repaving, and then to repave as much of the trail as funds allow.

- An Ohio State Park employee will be assigned full-time to the Little Miami State Park. We expect this employee will have access to existing state equipment such as a backhoe, power brush, and dump truck. The Friends welcome the opportunity to work with this new state employee resource.
- A pending grant from the National Park Service would repave over 7 miles of the trail from Cunningham Road in Camp Dennison to just north of Cones Road in Loveland.
- An opportunity to apply for a Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission grant that would fund repaving of the 6.5-mile portion of our trail in Greene County comes up in September 2015.

What does all this good news mean for the Friends of the Little Miami State Park? Primarily, it reinforces our philosophy that working with and supporting the state agencies responsible for the park promotes a better trail experience for us all. For example, the dedication of our volunteers and supporters, evident in the strong response to our pledge campaign last year, was vital to securing a grant that funded the completed repaving projects. Your big response to the state's online survey showed how important this park is to our community and certainly influenced the amount of help we now will receive from the state. FLMSP's Master List, the product of intimate knowledge coming from thousands of volunteer hours on the trail, documents specific trail needs in detail, facilitating the response generated by Obermiller's tour.

In short, the Friends believe their hard work over the last five years and the support of the community are finally paying off in a big way. We plan to continue our working relationship with Ohio Parks, for we believe we accomplish much more together than we can separately. With your continued support we can ensure our trail remains a treasured community resource for years to come.

NCCPAP Warns of Impact of ACA on Tax Season

Here is a recent article we thought you would like...

The National Conference of CPA Practitioners is warning that the complexities of the Affordable Care Act may negatively affect millions of taxpayers in the upcoming tax season.

Many taxpayers are unaware that their refund may be reduced or delayed -- or even vanish entirely -- due to issues tied to the act, the organization says, and many may find themselves confused by the new forms and reporting requirements.

"The 8 million-plus taxpayers who purchased health insurance on the Exchange may be in for an unpleasant surprise," said CPA Stephen Mankowski, who is chair of NCCPAP's Tax Policy Committee in a statement. Many of them received an Advanced Premium Tax Credit, which subsidized their premiums, but any number of life changes -- including a raise, a new job, getting married or getting divorced -- could render them ineligible for the credit. "Essentially these life changes could cause a taxpayer to lose the subsidy, resulting in an increase in said taxpayer's taxes, a loss of refund or a balance due."

Taxpayers who received the credits will need to reconcile them against their current circumstances -- a complicated process. And all taxpayers will need to answer questions regarding their minimum essential coverage. They will also receive new forms whose purpose is unclear to them. "Taxpayers don't know what they don't know," Mankowski said. "The IRS is not aware of the potential fallout that could occur over the confusion regarding these forms, and most tax preparers are frankly unprepared."

"It is our opinion that the lack of widespread knowledge on this issue is because the new ACA related forms -- and their instructions -- were only recently released in draft form by the IRS; some were released as late as Oct.

15, 2014,” he continued. “No date has been set for the release of the final forms and instructions. This could delay the start of the filing season, which will delay the processing of those still eligible for refunds.”

As a result, NCCPAP is recommending that the government delay implementing this part of the ACA for one year, to give tax preparers time to set proper expectations with their clients.

There may be a lot of unhappy taxpayers this upcoming tax season. Please don't shoot the messenger!
